our concepts of Brotherhood, Cheerfulness, and Service would be necessary.

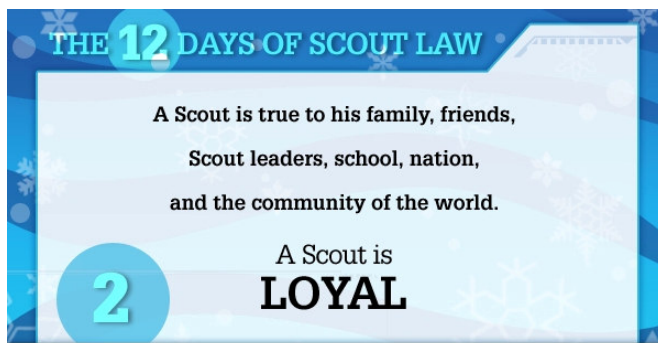

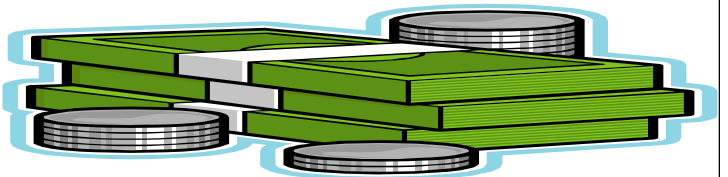

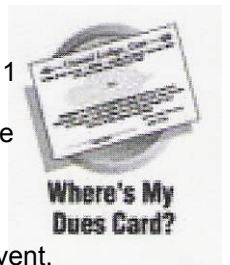

## Section News from Associate Adviser Mr. Ken Knaebel

**Summit Corps:** Summit Corps runs every week in July 2011. The dates are July 3-9, July 10-16, July 17-23, and July 24-30. Participation is limited to 500 per week. Lodges are guaranteed 8 slots. The lodge must travel as a contingent and attend the same week. Registration begins September 20, 2010. Lodges will be limited to a maximum of 23 people. The 8 slots will be held until December 1, 2010. At that time, if a lodge has sent in more than 8 deposits, National will begin awarding slots to the waiting lists. The Lodge must choose the week that it wants to participate. There is the chance that the week we choose will be full, so do not wait. Deposits of \$100 per person are due December 1. Total cost is \$250. Minimum age is 14. Participants will be staying at a National Guard Armory. More information is available at <http://event.oa-bsa.org/events/summitcorps2011/>.



**Indian Summer:** Indian Summer is August 1-6, 2011 at the Ridgecrest Conference Center in Ridgecrest, NC. Lodges are guaranteed 10 slots for Indian Summer and there is a maximum of 1100 participants. Lodges need to send their deposits in by March 1, 2011. Nothing was said about how the waiting list will be handled, but I guess it is the same as Summit Corps, except with the different deadline. Cost for Indian Summer is \$325 for people who want to stay in housing that holds 6-8 people, or \$425 for those that would like to share a hotel room/dorm with one other person. There are a total of 200 hotel room/dorm spaces available. More information is available at <http://event.oa-bsa.org/events/is2011/>.

**NLS/NLATS:** November 4-6, 2011 at the FFA camp in Haines City, FL. This does not conflict with Section Seminars. This is in our "backyard" and we need to send people. It's a long time away, but it is something that should start being mentioned in LECs. Registration for this will be online with a new procedure. **OA High Adventure:** OA Ocean Adventure is back. The program has changed. It is 4 days of service and then 4 days of sailing, snorkeling, kayaking, and fishing. There are 6 sessions of 36 participants. Scouts who have participated in other OA high adventure will be given priority.

*As Scouting's National Honor Society, our purpose is to:*

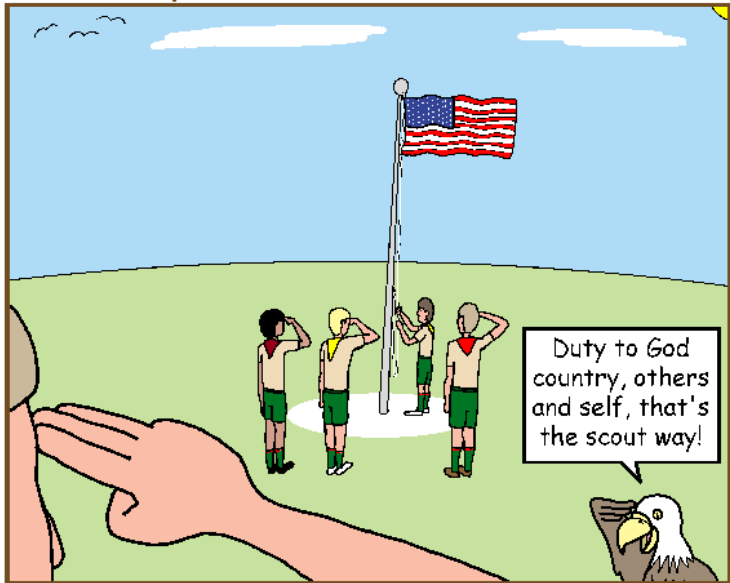
- *Recognize those who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives and through that recognition cause others to conduct themselves in a way that warrants similar recognition.*
